MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING APRIL 24, 2018 7PM

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall Becknall Community Center 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229. Gary W. Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Council members present: Mike Exton, Dorleen Garrett, Peggy Druin, and Phillip Radford.

Also, in attendance: City Attorney Mark Edison, City Clerk Micheale McCauley.

Absent: Denver Matthews and Gary Wilson.

City Clerk McCauley read the minutes from the Regular City Council Meeting March 27, 2018. Mike Exton made a motion to accept the minutes from the March Regular City Council Meeting. Peggy Druin 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Dorleen Garrett made a motion to accept the Financial Report from March 2018. Peggy Druin 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Mayor Hatcher reported on Clean-up Day April 21, 2018 from 8am-12pm was a success using 2 full dumpsters and allowing Marty Hester to collect the scraps. Mayor Hatcher thanked Mike Exton, Gary Wilson, John Fries, Darlene Herps and Kara Pugh for all their help during cleanup.

City Attorney Mark Edison reported the Utility Company, TESINC / MCI Metro has not yet designed as to where they will be placing the fiberoptic cable that is replacing the 25-year-old existing cable. They are under the assumption they will cross into Pioneer Village easements in the future. When TESINC does proceed they will need to purchase a Business License first. Also discussed was the Franchise Fee vs. State Monies.

Mayor Hatcher reported the 2018 Ford Explorer was ordered and should be ready for pickup in early July 2018.

NEW BUSINESS

City Attorney Mark Edison announced the City's 2017 Delinquent Tax Bills were for sale totaling \$806.81. The City received a bid for \$806.81 from Gary Wilson. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the bid for the sale of 2017 delinquent tax bills for \$806.81. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Correction: The advertising costs of \$298.35 was not added to total Tax Bill total. The new amount is \$1105.16.

COUNCIL BUSINESS

Peggy Druin states there are potholes on Spring Meadow Dr and she received a complaint about trees, bushes and overgrowth from 4612 Springfield Ct. City Attorney Mark Edison stated he will notify the homeowner to resolve the issues.

Mayor Hatcher discussed an increase of \$2000 per quarter to Hebron Estates for police protection provided by the Pioneer Village Police Department.

Mayor Hatcher also discussed the current Pension 12% phase in for this year and the incoming years until total percentage is reached.

POLICE BUSINESS

Chief Reynolds reported Officer Ray Wilburn stopped three suspects in possession of stolen items on Cobblestone resulting in all being arrested. The Chief also reported a string of garage/shed thefts by forced entry in early hours of the morning. The area the thefts covered included Spring Meadow, Old Pioneer Village and Meadow Brook Subdivision.

MAGISTRATE LASWELL

Magistrate Laswell reported the Bullitt County Cleanup Day will be Saturday April 28, 2018 from 8am-4pm at North Bullitt High School.

Also, Magistrate Laswell stated he is running for 3rd District Magistrate and is asking for residents vote at election time.

PLANNING & ZONING

Planning and Zoning Representative Tony Thompson had nothing to report for Pioneer Village. Peggy Druin asked about work being done around John Harper area which Mayor Hatcher explained a new trunk line is being put in for new sewers to expand on existing sewer plant.

PUBLIC BUSINESS

Walt Scholar stated he is running for Bullitt County Sheriff and is asking for your vote.

Dorleen Garrett made a motion to adjourn the City Council Meeting on April 24, 2018. Phillip Radford 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
