MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING AUGUST 28, 2018 7 PM

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall Becknall Community Center 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229. Mayor Gary Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

All Recited the Pledge Allegiance

City Clerk McCauley read the Minutes from July 24, 2018 Regular City Council Meeting. Mike Exton made a motion to approve minutes. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the Financial Report from July 24, 2018. Gary Wilson 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

The 2018 Ford Explorer is now in service assigned to Officer Nick Hibbs.

NEW BUSINESS

Officers Jeff Carter and Adam Wheeler have joined the Hillview Police Department. The Pioneer Village Police Department has hired Officer Mike McNear and Officer Tony Tulipano.

The paving of Morningside Drive was completed on August 3, 2018. Mayor Hatcher reported the width of the state rite of way entrance should have been 20 feet and was not correctly done by Walser.

The Council discussed the pothole issue on Morningside Dr and Summers Dr involving Rhonda Priddy. Ms. Priddy provided an estimate of damages which did not match damages that would be caused by a pothole. After discussion by the Council, City Attorney Edison determined Ms. Priddy would need to provide further proof the damages were caused by the pothole.

Interlocal Agreement with Bullitt County Fiscal Court and City of Pioneer Village to trim trees on Summitt Drive for the buses to have clearance. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the Interlocal Agreement with Bullitt County Fiscal Court and City of Pioneer Village. Gary Wilson 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Attorney Edison read the 1st reading of Ordinance 2018-07 Establishing a Code Enforcement Board. The Council members raised questions and concern with who should be appointed as the Code Enforcement Officer.

POLICE BUSINESS

The July police run report shows 241 runs made by Pioneer Village Police, not including domestic reports. Here are some runs they responded to: a report of a stolen moped, theft of property by person moving out of resident, property damage by neighbor putting up new fence and cutting down other neighbors' fence, theft of a concrete statue. Chief Reynolds ran radar at Preston Hwy and Shepherds Way for five days and determined no one was speeding.

Chief Reynolds announced Officer Ray Wilburn will be retiring in December and will also be running for Mayor of Hillview.


PUBLIC BUSINESS

Dorleen Garrett made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Phillip Radford^{2nd} the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.


