PUBLIC BUSINESS


Danny Rayhill from Running Creek Dr received a notice of zoning change from Hillview. Resident Rayhill is concerned about construction traffic on street. Mayor Hatcher stated Pioneer Village does not have a proposal for the Senior Living Apartments with 80 units. Attorney Edison will have to find out the number of entrances that are dictated by the Fire Marshall.

Jennifer Picheo from Hebron Woods states Pioneer Village taxpayer's are very concerned for the safety, security and wellbeing of the residents. This project will add more traffic, property value decrease, loss of revenue and stormwater / sewage issues for Pioneer Village not Hillview. Jennifer Picheo asked council to block access for senior living facility. Attorney Edison states you cannot restrict public access to public street. Attorney Edison suggest a yearly maintenance fee to upkeep the entrance roads. Mayor Hatcher states again that Pioneer Village does not have a proposal for the Senior Living Apartments with 80 units.
