- ✚ Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from May 28, 2019. Mike Exton made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes with corrections. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

COUNCIL BUSINESS

- ✚ Peggy Druin advises there is a pothole on Spring Meadow Drive.
- ✚ Denver Matthews observed an excessive number of cars in a driveway on Pioneer Trail. Denver Matthews and Dorleen Garrett are seeing numerous amounts of signs along the roadways. Specific phone number from signs were given to Attorney Edison. Mayor Hatcher states the City can pull the signs on the State rite-of-ways.
- ✚ Dorleen Garrett asked what John Fries does for the City. Mayor Hatcher states he does all the sign maintenance in the City along with picking up trash at all the entrances and medians.
- ✚ Peggy Druin said Hot Shot Trucking Company will be moving in by KY Farm Bureau.

POLICE BUSINESS

Pioneer Village May Run Report which included 115 responses.

Chief DJ Reynolds reported the following events:

- ❖ 5/31 - police were dispatched to burglary in progress, Officers found male subject there who did not live there. Subject forced entry into residence was found holding a puppy which he had stolen from a different residence the same night. Subject was arrested and taken to jail.
- ❖ 6/19 – At Storage 911, seven storage units and a storage trailer were broken into. Subjects cut a hole in fence on back of the property. The doors on the storage units were damaged. Several items were taken from the units. There was a white and black male that was caught on the security cameras with very good video and pictures. This event happened around 6am. This case will be investigated by Officer JC Witherspoon, who will notify the media.
- ❖ 6/23 – Around 8:30 pm Officers respond to a report of an assault. The young male who lived there told Officers he was assaulted in Hillview on the parking lot of Overdale Elementary. His backpack with items inside were taken. The young male stated it was a white male about 5’8” wearing a black hoodie. No medical attention was needed.
- ❖ Pioneer Village Police are still doing traffic enforcement in various areas around the City.
