POLICE BUSINESS

August Run Report for Pioneer Village Police Department totals 255 responses. Chief DJ Reynolds reported the following events:

- ❖ During the past month, only criminal response was on 9/22 in Running Creek a 9mm pistol was taken out of an unlocked vehicle.

- ❖ 9/24 there was a very serious motorcycle accident on Preston Hwy just South of Meadowbrook subdivision. The van headed south on Preston hit motorcycle in rear, which the driver of motorcycle was injured very seriously.
- ❖ Officer Witherspoon has a good suspect for Storage 911 break-ins. Also, he has suspects for the Scenic Trail break-ins, there was some property recovered.
- ❖ We need a stoplight in the area between Cardinal and second entrance to Meadowbrook.
- ❖ Pioneer Village Police are still doing traffic control in different place within the City.
- ⚡ Officer Witherspoon spoke about the break-ins at Storage 911 that was on the news. After it was put on the news channels, he received 24 calls with a suspect's name from the first break-in. He is working with the 9th Mobile Gang Unit at LMPD. The department is also working with the 7th Division of LMPD on the second break-in at Storage 911, suspects were moving items from one storage facility to another who left keys to storage unit in a vehicle he was robbing inside the storage facility with his girlfriend.
- ⚡ There have been two recovered stolen vehicles from Pioneer Village.
- ⚡ The department has worked 14 collisions with in the last two weeks.
- ⚡ Chief DJ Reynolds went to DARE school and is certified to teach. He will be teaching 4th & 5th graders at Maryville Elementary and Freedom Elementary in January 2020.

- ⚡ Tony Thompson report – nothing in PV. Salt Lick Road Cell Tower being built w/ 5G.


PUBLIC BUSINESS

- ⚡ Richard Luce discussed his Cancer Support Group will meet October 17, 2019 at the Hillview Rec Center.


ADJOURNMENT
