MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING 7PM, OCTOBER 22, 2019

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall Becknall Community Center 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229.

Mayor Gary Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Council Members present Denver Matthews, Peggy Druin, Mike Exton, Phillip Radford, Dorleen Garrett and Gary Wilson.

Also, in attendance: City Attorney Mark Edison and City Clerk Micheale McCauley

Invocation: by Denver Matthews All recited the Pledge of Allegiance

- ⚡ Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from September 24, 2019. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes as read. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
 - ⚡ Dorleen Garrett made a motion to accept the financial report from September 30, 2019. Phillip Radford 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

- ⚡ Attorney Mark Edison read the 1st reading of Ordinance 2019-07 Amending Budget FY 18-19.
- ⚡ Attorney Mark Edison explained this is a one-time fee for Bullitt County Fiscal Court Invoice #107 for \$1200.00 for Supplement Radio Tower Costs. Invoices were sent to all the police, fire and EMS departments to share the cost of \$34,000 between all who use the 911 Services. Mike Exton would have liked to have seen this fee more evenly distributed. This was mentioned in the Police Chiefs meeting to be approved by the Mayors. Mayor Hatcher has decided to bring it to the council to vote on. Peggy Druin made a motion to pay the one-time fee for Bullitt County Fiscal Court Invoice #107 for \$1200.00 for Supplement Radio Tower Costs. Denver Matthews 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

- ⚡ Peggy Druin made a motion to participate in the 2019 Halloween at Zoneton Fire Department and to spend \$150.00 to purchase candy for the event. Phillip Radford 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ⚡ Resident Mike Guntle asked permission to run his radio-controlled cars in the City field next to City Hall. The cars can go up to 70 mph and are approximately 2 feet long and are made to be run off road for 25 minutes per charge. Residents have nowhere in Bullitt & Jefferson Counties to run said cars. City Attorney states resident would have to stay 50 ft away from the roadway along with time of day restrictions and will have to sign an agreement with the

City to run cars. Mike Exton made a motion for Resident Mike Guntle to run his RC cars in the field by City Hall contingent on occupancy agreement is signed by resident and City. Gary Wilson 2nd the motion. Five Council members aye and one vote no by Dorleen Garrett. Motion Carried.

COUNCIL BUSINESS

- ⚡ Peggy Druin asking about getting more red lights on Preston Highway. Attorney Mark Edison said he sent a letter to the State Highway Department for a study to reduce speed.
- ⚡ Peggy Druin also asked about the status of Storage 911 break-ins. Attorney Mark Edison also sent a letter to Storage 911 on the recent excessive police calls. Also, the Storage 911 facility does not have adequate light, cameras and security. Pioneer Village Police regularly patrol the facility several times each night. The City can regulate Storage 911 to have certain security features.

POLICE BUSINESS 208

- ⚡ 9/25 Officer was notified of Black BMW traveling at a high rate of speed south on Preston Hwy being chased by Louisville Metro. Metro Officer observed vehicle turning into an Old Pioneer Village driveway, then was taken into custody then to jail.
- ⚡ 9/30 Received a run on vehicle that was broken into at John Harper & Preston Hwy near the Funeral Home. He ran out of gas and left it overnight when the stereo and speakers were taken, and the dash was damaged.
- ⚡ 10/4 Chief Reynolds and two other Officer will be handing out candy at Kroger's at Mud Lane for Halloween.
