

ORDINANCE NO. 84-2

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE POSITION OF POLICE CHIEF AND POLICE OFFICER OF THE CITY OF PIONEER VILLAGE, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY, FIXING THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, TENURE, AND COMPENSATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PIONEER VILLAGE, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE: DUTIES OF POLICE CHIEF:

The Police Chief shall:

1. Plan, direct, and exercise general supervision over the work of the police department.
2. Formulate and enforce rules and regulations, work methods, and procedures.
3. Make and review all personnel assignments within the Department.
4. Review activities and reports of officers.
5. Make recommendations to the Police Commissioner and City Council for the appointment, promotion, and dismissal of officers.
6. Enforce disciplinary measures when necessary.
7. Ascertain that officers receive adequate training in modern police methods and procedures.
8. Direct the preparation and maintenance of police records and files.
9. Direct the investigation of major criminal offenses.
10. Cooperate with State and Federal Officers in the apprehension of wanted persons.
11. See that reports are prepared for the City Council, National Safety Council, and Federal Bureau of Investigation.
12. Prepare budget estimates and control the expenditure of Department Funds.
13. Conduct Department correspondence, requisition supplies, recommend the purchase of needed equipment.
14. Meet with and answer questions for the public.
15. Attend police conferences and meet with various citizens' groups.

The duties of a police officer shall be to:

1. Patrol a designated area of the City in a patrol car to prevent and discover the commission of crime and to enforce traffic regulations; answer calls and complaints; administer first aid; serve warrants; and answer questions for the public.

2. Conduct preliminary investigations at the scene of crimes and serious accidents; gather evidence; locate and interview witnesses; make arrests and interrogate prisoners; compile accident statistics.

3. Direct traffic at intersections and at accidents and fires; maintain order in crowds, at parades, and other public meetings.

4. Operate electronic equipment for speed detection.

5. Process prisoners, provide for their needs and supervise their activities; appear in court to present evidence and testify against the person accused of crimes.

6. Prepare and maintain necessary records and reports.

7. Participate in training activities.

8. Give advice on laws and ordinances and general information to the public.

9. Perform related work as required.

SECTION TWO: QUALIFICATIONS:

The applicant for police chief shall have graduated from high school and completed the ten (10) week basic training program with the Division of Law Enforcement Training or have completed seven (7) to ten (10) years of practical experience and completed the ten (10) week basic training program with the Division of Law Enforcement Training.

The applicant for police officer shall have graduated from high school and shall meet the requirements established by the City Council in its rules and regulations of the City Police Department which have previously been adopted.

All applicants for these positions shall be over the age of twenty-one (21).

SECTION THREE: TENURE:

These positions shall exist until terminated by appropriate action taken by the City Council.

SECTION FOUR: COMPENSATION:

The rate of compensation for the police chief and the full time and part-time city police officers shall be as established by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the City Council.


SECTION FIVE: EFFECTIVE DATE:

This Ordinance shall become effective on January 10, 1984.


SECTION SIX: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance or any part of this Ordinance are repealed.
