

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY  
ORDINANCE NO. 87-8

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PIONEER VILLAGE, KENTUCKY,  
DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. No person shall keep any livestock or poultry on a lot or tract having an area of less than ten (10) acres.

SECTION II. Any person violating this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00. Each day such violation shall continue shall constitute a separate violation.

SECTION III. As used in this ordinance:

(a) "Person" shall mean a person, firm, corporation, partnership, association of two (2) or more persons having a joint or common interest;

(b) "Livestock" shall mean horses, stallions, colts, geldings, mares, sheep, rams, lambs, bulls, bullocks, steers, helpers, cows, calves, mules, jacks, jennets, burros, goats, kids and swine; and *hares & rabbits*

(c) "Poultry" shall mean all domesticated fowl and all game birds which are legally kept in captivity.

SECTION IV. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any part of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION V. Should any section, clause, line, paragraph, or part of this ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same shall not affect the remainder of this ordinance.
