**MINUTES REGULAR** CITY COUNCIL MEETING 7PM, February 25, 2020

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall Becknall Community Center 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229.

Mayor Gary Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

- ⊕ Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from January 28, 2020. Mike Exton made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes with corrections. Gary Wilson 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ⊕ Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the financial report from January 31, 2020. Dorleen Garrett 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

## OLD BUSINESS

Peggy Druin inquired about the status on 911 Storage updates requested by the City. Chief Reynolds met with the Michael Whipple, president of 911 Storage who said they would grant the Police access to the camera system on their phones. Michael Whipple will get with his camera guys to make this happen. Also, he stated he was working on the fence to be more rigid and secure with possibly creating a natural barrier with thorn bushes.

## NEW BUSINESS

Attorney Edison read Resolution 2020-02 Supporting the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept Resolution 2020-02 Supporting the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment. Mike Exton 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

The Council agreed to set the Spring Cleanup Day on April 18, 2020 with a rain date of April 25, 2020. The Fall Cleanup Day was set for September 19, 2020 with a rain date of September 26, 2020. Both Cleanup Days will be from 9am to 12pm.

The 2020 Census paperwork will be mailed out to residents between March 12<sup>th</sup> and March 20<sup>th</sup>. Residents must fill out the Census paperwork per federal law. Mayor Hatcher states it is very important for the residents of Pioneer Village to fill out the Census and with accurate information. During the 2010 Census the City lost <sup>revenue</sup> residents due to not all residents filling out the required paperwork. This loss significantly reduced the amount of money the City received.

Peggy Druin states she would volunteer at City Hall to help residents with the Census. Also, if they needed transportation, she would provide that too.

Mayor Hatcher states the City will notify the residents via a newsletter or flyer with information on the 2020 Census.

## COUNCIL BUSINESS

Mayor Hatcher advised the Council that the Garbage contract will expire on July 1, 2020 and will be put out for bid next month (March) to give both garbage companies time to transition into or out of the City.

There will be a Stormwater meeting with our engineer, Jim Harned and all the Mayors of Bullitt County on March 17, 2020 at the UofL Hospital South in the Medical Center Belcher Room from 5:30pm to 6:30pm. The Council members are not required to attend but are invited.

## POLICE BUSINESS *January*

Police run report for ~~December~~ includes 193 runs. Chief Reynolds report Includes the following events:

- ± Jan 29 – Resident on Acacia Ave reported an unknown person left a note on the mailbox concerning his dogs being left out in the cold. Resident states the dogs kept in kennels with shelter, food and water. Animal Control made a visit and determined that the living conditions of the dogs were suitable. Resident wanted to report this harassment and have a report filed, which was done.
- ± Feb 3<sup>rd</sup> – Feb 7<sup>th</sup> on 4702 Summitt Dr at Minis-U-Stuff-It there were 2 catalytic converters cut off one of the U-Haul trucks. Detective Witherspoon is still investigating.
- ± Feb 4<sup>th</sup> non injury collision at Cardinal Ave and Preston Hwy.
- ± Feb 15<sup>th</sup> non injury collision at Preston Hwy and John Harper Hwy.
- ± Feb 23<sup>rd</sup> Hillview Police had a vehicle run from with a male and female who bailed out on foot and ran into Pioneer Village. The Sheriff's Office and Pioneer Village assisted Hillview. Male was taken into custody on Ridgemont Rd and the female was taken into custody at Mini's-U-Stuff-It.

Chief Reynolds states he has 5 more weeks to teach DARE at Freedom and Maryville Elementary. Classes are moving along well.

Tony Thompson was present with no report.


## PUBLIC BUSINESS

Dorleen Garrett made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Gary Wilson 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.


