Peggy Druin made a motion to takeover the streetlight maintenance on Spring Meadow Ct and Spring Haven Ct from the HOA of Spring Meadow. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion Carried.

Mark Edison read the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2020-01 Budget Fiscal Year 2020-2021.

COUNCIL BUSINESS

- ⚡ Peggy Druin asked if the flags in City Hall could be cleaned. Mayor Hatcher said yes.

- ✚ Mayor Hatcher thanked Clerk McCauley and her daughters for doing a great job painting the Hall, which was paid from the Mayor's discretionary fund.
- ✚ Mayor Hatcher requested the Council consider accepting bids for a new floor in the Hall.

POLICE BUSINESS

- ✚ Police run report for February included 172 runs. Police run report for March included 144 runs. Chief Reynolds reported the runs for March were down due to how the calls are being handled due to COVID-19. Runs will be limited as much as possible, if run could be handled over phone, it would, if not the run will be made.
- ✚ Chief Reynolds was not able to complete the DARE Program at Freedom & Maryville Elementary Schools. The Chief is still planning to hold a DARE graduation.
- ✚ The Shattered Dreams Event at North Bullitt was cancelled.
- ✚ 3/4 - 3/14 on John Harper Hwy there were 4 non-injury and 1 injury accidents.
- ✚ 3/13 on Somerset Dr – unauthorized use of a motor vehicle.
- ✚ 3/14 on Morningside Dr – domestic.
- ✚ 3/25 on White Tail Cir – report of property damage due to someone driving through yard.
- ✚ 4/3 at Summitt Dr & Preston Hwy – non injury accident
- ✚ 4/5 on Somerset Dr – 4/5 on Ridgemont Rd - car gone through during the night with items taken from unlocked cars.
- ✚ Dealing with a resident on Pioneer Trail – running a repair shop and selling cars. A citation of \$500 was issued on 4/15. Investigation is ongoing. Attorney Edison was contacted by homeowner at Pioneer Trail who will meet with resident and explain the rules. The Mayor and the City is doing all we can to fix issue.
