## MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING 7PM, MAY 26, 2020

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall Becknall Community Center 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229.

Mayor Gary Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

All recited the Pledge of Allegiance

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- ⚡ Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from April 21, 2020. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes with corrections. Dorleen Garrett 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
  - ⚡ Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the financial report from April 30, 2020. Phillip Radford 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
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## OLD BUSINESS

Attorney Mark Edison read the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading of Ordinance 2020-01 Budget FY 2020-2021. Gary Wilson made a motion to accept Ordinance 2020-01 Budget FY 2020-2021. Phillip Radford 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

## NEW BUSINESS

Attorney Mark Edison read the four delinquent taxes up for bid in Pioneer Village. Gary Wilson was the only bidder of \$1248.97 for all four delinquent taxes. Denver Matthews made a motion to accept Gary Wilson's bid of \$1248.97 for the four delinquent taxes. Phillip Radford 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. The vote was 5-0 with Gary Wilson abstaining. ## COUNCIL BUSINESS

Denny Matthews asked about the construction on Running Creek. Attorney Edison and Mayor Hatcher negotiated with the developer to put a \$50,000.00 bond along with \$2750.00 yearly payment to repair road. Pioneer Village Ordinance requires the developer to get application for the entrance.

## POLICE BUSINESS

Police run report for April included 129 runs.

- ⚡ 5/3 – Summitt Drive at Mini's U-Stuff-it – Catalytic converters were cut off several RV campers parked in the back of the property. During the investigation, a saw blade and a duffel bag with converters were found by the back fence along with a new tennis shoe. Detective Witherspoon found a guy on Facebook with pictures of converters for sale.

- ⚡ 5/11 – Cardinal Ave – Ford Fusion was taken during the night. Owner said it was locked with a spare key left inside and his wallet.
- ⚡ 5/14 – N Preston Hwy – Little Flock Church report of pedestrian was struck in the parking lot by a minivan while he was taking pictures of the vehicle. Driver did not see him and ran over him. He was transported to the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.
- ⚡ 5/21 – John Harper Hwy – non injury accident
- ⚡ 5/23 – Preston Hwy - Detective Witherspoon discovered meth and marijuana in the vehicle while he was on a traffic stop. Driver was arrested.
