

**City of Pioneer Village  
Regular City Council Meeting  
February 23, 2016**

Regular Meeting of the Pioneer Village City Council was held at City Hall Becknall Community Center, 4700 Summitt Drive, Louisville, KY 40229. Gary W. Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Members present: Peggy Druin, Dorleen Garrett, Darlene Herps, Denver Matthews, Phillip Radford and Gary Wilson. Others in attendance were City Clerk Ricki Daniels and City Attorney Mark Edison.

Peggy Druin made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes for January. Darlene Herps 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the minutes for January. Darlene Herps 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the financial report for January. Denver Matthews 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

**OLD BUSINESS**

**Water Leak:** Mayor Hatcher reported that the water leak had been found and repaired. He also stated we had applied for a new meter to be installed.

**NEW BUSINESS**

**Salt Spreader:** Mayor Hatcher informed the Council he had purchased a salt spreader for the dump truck, which holds about 2 cubic yards of salt. The cost was about \$7,000. He also stated Magistrate Laswell assisted with an agreement with Fiscal Court for us to buy our salt from them. Mark Edison read Resolution 2016-03, allowing for an interlocal agreement between the City and Fiscal Court, for the purpose of road maintenance, which can be renewed yearly. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept Resolution 2016-03. Dorleen Garrett 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

**Surplus Dodge Pickup:** Mayor Hatcher asked the Council to surplus the Dodge pickup with salt spreader. He stated the City of Hunters Hollow is interested in buying the truck/salt spreader, he suggested since it was another City that we would be selling it to, that we consider a lesser selling price for the truck. After a short discussion, Peggy Druin made a motion to surplus the Dodge pickup as it is no longer useful to the City and sell it to another government entity for \$500. If they decide not to purchase the truck then we would sell it on govdeals. Gary Wilson 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

**Complaint about Church:** Mayor Hatcher reported there has been a complaint about the Church on Summitt Drive that has just expanded. The complaint concerns noise coming from the Church, as well as asking if the Church can be made to put up a privacy fence since it was very close to a residential area. Mayor Hatcher stated that the Church music stops at 8pm, and he said he was told they do plan to put up a privacy fence in the future. He also said the residents in the area could put up a privacy fence if they choose.

**COUNCIL BUSINESS**

Councilwoman Garrett stated the street light was still out on Cardinal Ave. Clerk Daniels will call the outage in.

**POLICE REPORT**

Chief Reynolds stated there had been a couple of break-ins to the construction site area at Maryville Elementary. He stated that at least one person had been caught in Jefferson County and confessed to the break-ins. He stated we have filled charges in Bullitt County on the individual.

## PLANNING AND ZONING REPORT

Tony Thompson stated there have been no zoning changes heard concerning our City. He also stated he had talked with Brian Richardson about adding our zoning to the current digitized zoning maps for the County. Tony stated that a reasonable cost of possibly \$250 could be assessed for adding our zoning to the current County maps. Peggy Druin made a motion to authorize up to \$250 to have Planning and Zoning to add our zoning to their maps. Dorleen Garrett 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

## MAGISTRATE LASWELL

Magistrate Laswell stated Fiscal Court is looking very hard as to whether the County can continue to support the pools in the County. He stated the increase in maintenance costs may not be financially feasible.

## PUBLIC BUSINESS


Mayor Hatcher reminded everyone of the upcoming Republican caucus to be held on Saturday, March 5, 2016 from 10-4 at BCHS.
