

**City of Pioneer Village

### **OLD BUSINESS**

**Annexation Response:** Attorney Edison stated that the City had received a response to the proposed annexation. He stated the property owners of both properties which have been proposed to be annexed have replied in opposition to the annexation. ### **POLICE REPORT**

Chief Reynolds thanked the Council for approving the purchase of two new vehicles. He reported there has recently been several cars broke into in Hebron Woods. He stated they would increase patrols.

### **PUBLIC BUSINESS**

Jennifer Picheo of Hebron Woods addressed the Council and asked for their support in opposing the proposed meth clinic to be built in nearby Hillview, which adjoins Hebron Woods. She spoke on behalf of the residents in opposition of the proposed clinic.

Concerns were the increase of crime, additional police protection, and safety in the area, as well as close proximity of schools, increased traffic and sewer capacity.

Mr. Hester the owner of the property where the clinic would be built addressed the opponents and the Council, stating if the proposed business is a meth clinic he would not allow the business to build on his property. His comments were well received by the residents in opposition.
