

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING ADVALORUM TAXES AND PROVIDING  
ASSESSMENT, EQUALIZATION AND COLLECTION



The City Council of the City of Pioneer Village, Kentucky, does ordain as follows:

1. That an advalorum tax of 10.5 cents on each \$100.00 of value of all property taxable for municipal purposes except property assessed by the state, in said city, is hereby levied for the year 1984 as of January 1, 1984.
2. That said levy is made for the purpose of raising revenue to pay salaries of officers and employees, for the repair and maintenance of streets and public ways and public buildings in said City, to pay for lighting city streets, and to pay all proper charges and legal demands against the city.
3. That the assessment made by the Bullitt County Tax Commissioner for state and county purposes for 1984 shall be and is hereby adopted as the assessment for City purposes, and the City tax bills shall be made from the County lists and tax commissioner's books after they have been supervised and corrected by the County Board of Equalization.
4. That the City Clerk shall take the lists of all persons subject to city taxation, who are not shown on the County Tax Commissioner's books and shall list all property a portion of which is in the city except farm land, where the value of the portion in the city is not shown on the County Tax Commissioner's books.
5. That the City Clerk be, and she is hereby, directed to prepare tax bills for all persons and organizations in the City of Pioneer Village, Kentucky, against whom taxes have been levied and she is hereby directed to notify such persons and organizations that, on and after January 1, 1985, any tax bill remaining unpaid will be declared delinquent and bear interest at six percent (6%) per annum or one-half of one percent per month or fraction thereof until paid, and in addition thereon, a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount for general purposes shall be added for nonpayment when due. Said Clerk shall also indicate that a discount of two percent (2%) will be allowed on bills paid before November 1, 1984.
6. After January 1, 1985, the Clerk will mark all unpaid tax bills in red ink DELINQUENT and add the penalty of ten percent (10%) as provided herein and report to the City Council the number of unpaid bills and the amount hereof and the Mayor will check all tax bills and correct errors, if any, and deliver the tax books back to the Clerk, who will proceed with the collection of all delinquent taxes, penalty, and interest and will report to the City Council at its regular meeting each month.

7. The Clerk is directed to advertise the above as provided by laws.
