

**AN ORDINANCE LEVYING AD VALOREM TAXES AND PROVIDING  
ASSESSMENT, EQUALIZATION AND COLLECTION**

**ORDINANCE NO. 02-006**

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor vetoed the prior tax rate Ordinance and, an emergency is declared to suspend the requirements of the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading of this Ordinance. Such Emergency being the need to give taxpayers reasonable time for discounted amount by November 1, 2002 and to receive tax revenues in a timely manner.

The City Council of the City of Pioneer Village, Kentucky does ordain as follows:

1. That an Ad Valorem tax of 13.2 cents (\$00.132) on each \$100.00 of value of all property taxable for municipal purposes except property assessed by the state, in said city, is hereby levied for the year 2002, as January 1, 2002.
2. That said levy is made for the purpose of raising revenue to pay salaries of officers and employees, for the repair in said city, to pay for lighting city streets, and to pay all proper charges, and legal demands against the city.
3. That the assessment made by the Bullitt County Property Valuation Administrator shall be and is hereby adopted as the assessment of city purposes and the city tax bills shall be made from the County lists and Property valuation administrator's books after they have been supervised and corrected by the County Board of Assessment.
4. That the City Clerk shall take the list of all persons subject to city taxation, who are not shown on the county Property Valuation Administrator's books and shall list all property a portion of which is in the city except farm land, where the value of the portion in the city is not shown on the county Property Valuation Administrator's books.
5. That the City Clerk be, and she is hereby, directed to prepare tax bills for all persons and organizations in the City of Pioneer Village, Kentucky, against whom taxes have been levied and that, on and after January 1, 2003, and tax bills remaining unpaid will be declared delinquent and bear addition thereon, a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount for general purposes shall be added for nonpayment when due. Said clerk shall also indicate that a discount of two percent (2%) will be allowed on bills paid before November 1, 2002.
6. After January 1, 2003, The Clerk will mark all unpaid tax bills in red in DELINQUENT and add the penalty of ten percent (10%) as provided herein and report to the City Council the number of unpaid bills and the amount hereof and the Mayor will check all tax bills and correct errors, if any, and deliver the tax books back to the clerk who will proceed with the collection of all delinquent

taxes, penalties, and interest and will report to the City Council at its regular meeting each month.

7. The clerk is directed to advertise the above as provided by the law.




