Budget: A copy of the monthly budget statement was handed out and reviewed. Motion to pay monthly bills was made by Comm. Allen and seconded by Comm. Forshee; Motion Passed 4/0.

Old Business: Comm. Forshee asked if any letters had been sent out to delinquent tax payers. Mayor Clark thought so.

New Business: Atty. Edison read a first reading on Budget for Fiscal Year July1, 2010- June 30, 2011. Mayor Clark thought that the decimal may not be right on the amount for Storm Water Drainage.
