MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING 7PM, MARCH 23, 2021

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall Becknall Community Center 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229. Mayor Gary Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:10pm.

All recited the Pledge of Allegiance

✚ Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from February 23, 2021. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes as read. Dorleen Garrett 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

✚ Mike Exton made a motion to accept the financial report from February 28, 2021. Peggy Druin 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

## OLD BUSINESS

✚ Clerk McCauley gave an update on the 2020 Delinquent Tax Bills. Seven, 2<sup>nd</sup> certified delinquent letters were mailed on March 15, 2021. Five remain unpaid as of March 23, 2021.

✚ Mayor Hatcher suggest the resident at 4602 Springdale Ct be cited for a violations through Planning & Zoning instead of through the City. All the Council member agreed. Attorney Edison will start the process. Peggy Druin stated there was another resident who recently moved in the area was also in violation.

## NEW BUSINESS

✚ Mayor Hatcher and all other Mayors met with County Judge, Jerry Summers on March 23, 2021 concerning the American Recovery Plan. Every County & City in KY will receive money from the Plan for infrastructure, enhancement of broadband services and a variety of other eligible items. The City will receive ½ of funds this year and the other ½ in year 2 or 3. More information will be available in the coming weeks. There will be roundtable meeting for the Mayors, Judge Summers, and Congressmen Brett Guthrie on April 8<sup>th</sup>.

✚ Attorney Edison explained the proposed Interlocal Agreement between Bullitt County Sanitation District and MSD. The proposal transfers ownership of sewers in the North End of Bullitt County to MSD. The cost proposal rate will stay the same for 1 year then increase by 12 % per year for 3 years and level off to 3% per year until equalized with Jefferson County residents. There is nothing mention in proposal for expansion.

✚ Peggy Druin stated there is a few potholes on Summitt Drive and one by Maryville Elementary School. Dorleen Garrett reported a streetlight out in front of 3342 Cardinal Ave.

- ✦ Feb 27<sup>th</sup> on Audubon Ave – report of a silver Tahoe around area with a gun. Caller gave the officer information on the person.
- ✦ Mar 3<sup>rd</sup> on Greymont Dr – report of identity theft.
- ✦ Mar 17<sup>th</sup> at Accurate Automotive – a terminated employee became disorderly and was asked to leave.
- ✦ Mar 18<sup>th</sup> at Somerset Dr – report of a gold Chevy had struck a mailbox and trash cans.
- ✦ Elementary on 3/15 and Middle School on 3/22 are back to four days a week and High School will start the four days a week on 3/29. There is talk about all returning to five days a week after spring break.
- ✦ Mar 22<sup>nd</sup> at Somerset Dr – report of male juvenile riding his bike down the street when a group of juveniles threw a stick at his bike that went through the front spokes causing him to flip over the handlebars and sustain broken bones. This incident is under investigation.

## PUBLIC BUSINESS




