

Public Hearing – LG&E & Municipal Road Aid Funds FY 21-22. Mayor Hatcher opened meeting at 6:45pm. Meeting to determine how to expend potential funds. Mayor Hatcher states money is used for maintenance of the ditches, mowing, medians, and repair of bad tiles under road. The City pushed for the gas tax increase but was not passed resulting in decreased funding of the MRAF. Asphalt pricing today is approximately \$52 per ton and was \$28 per ton when streets were last done. Meeting adjourned at 7:00pm.

MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING 7PM, MAY 25, 2021

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall Becknall Community Center 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229. Mayor Gary Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Invocation: by Denver Matthews All recited the Pledge of Allegiance

- ⚡ Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from April 27, 2021. Denver Matthews made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes as read. Peggy Druin 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ⚡ Dorleen Garrett made a motion to accept the financial report from April 30, 2021. Peggy Druin 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

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OLD BUSINESS

- ⚡ Attorney Edison read the second reading of Ordinance 2021-01 Budget FY 2021-2022. Mike Exton made a motion to accept Ordinance 2021-01 Budget FY 2021-2022. *2nd By Denver Matthews, AIP, Conced. **
- ⚡ Clerk McCauley updated Council on the American Rescue Plan Act. As of May 10, 2021, Pioneer Village is scheduled to receive \$761,783.00 from the ARPA. The proposed regulations on how money can be spent is not final. Money can be spent on broadband, infrastructure, and water.

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NEW BUSINESS

- ⚡ Mayor Hatcher explained about LG&E request for an easement for underground electric on Running Creek Dr (for Linda's Place Apartments). LG&E tried to place overhead powerlines in but the City stopped it. Mayor Hatcher spoke with project manager Josh Hooper to suggest moving poles back on property 15' and would not be an issue for the City. LG&E's plan is to go from single phase to convert to three phase electric for the project. Peggy Druin made a motion to grant LG&E's request for an easement for underground electric. Denver Matthews 2nd the motion. Mike Exton opposed; vote was: 4 -votes for / 1-vote against / 1-no vote. Resident Ms. Rossen asked how they would put back to original when they trimmed trees along Running Creek Dr. Mayor Hatcher explained the Trees served as a buffer zone of 75-100 ft.

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COUNCIL BUSINESS

- ⚡ Denver Matthews questioned the single-phase electric plan. Josh Hooper said they are planning to run overhead lines from Morningside Dr to the property line. There is no electric from Morningside Dr to Blue Lick Road.

- ✚ None.


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
ADJOURNMENT
