MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING 7PM, JUNE 22, 2021

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall Becknall Community Center 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229. Mayor Gary Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

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Invocation: by Denver Matthews All recited the Pledge of Allegiance

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- ⚡ Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from May 25, 2021. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes with addition. Dorleen Garrett 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
  - ⚡ Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the financial report from May 31, 2021. Denver Matthews 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

## OLD BUSINESS

- ⚡ Mayor Hatcher updated all on LG&E not using the encroachment process. Instead, they will use the three phase from the Hillview side to the easements on Running Creek Dr.

## NEW BUSINESS

- ⚡ Mayor Hatcher would like to increase the Mayor's salary for the next term. Peggy Druin inquired if the increase is in the budget. Clerk McCauley said the funds could be covered by the increase of the insurance tax. In addition, Pioneer Village has increased the policing contract with Hebron Estates to \$90,000 per year. The Council will revisit and discuss later.
- ⚡ Mayor Hatcher would also like to increase the Council salary for the next term. Attorney Edison said the salary for Mayor and Council is set by Ordinance and must be passed before May in the year office is ran for. Mayor Hatcher asked the Council to think about the increase for the Council to \$100 per month and the Mayor to \$2000 per month which would take effect on January 1, 2023 . The Council will revisit and discuss later.
- ⚡ Mayor Hatcher informed the Council about the results of the study by the Police Dept. on Spring Meadow Dr by running radar. The highest speed was 27 mph. The Police Officer running radar spoke to several residents about their speed. There will be more studies to come. Peggy Druin strongly opposed placing speed humps on Spring Meadow Dr. Mayor Hatcher suggest the rollover humps that has 12' length, on Spring Meadow Dr and Springfield Ct and the other one at Spring Meadow Ct.

## COUNCIL BUSINESS

- ⚡ Mayor Hatcher advised the grant for the walk park will come out sometime in August 2021.
- ⚡ Dorleen Garrett suggest her and the City Works Dept to clean up trash in front of garage at 4622 Springfield Ct. Attorney Edison advised he received payment for all the clean-up liens and citations issued by the City of Pioneer Village from the new mortgage company, Rez. Also advised against resident Dorleen Garrett to clean up the property at 4622 Springfield Ct. Attorney Edison will send a letter to the new mortgage company, Rez to give them the opportunity to clean-up the property. When the mortgage company gets property in their name they will advertise in the Pioneer News for three weeks, then it will be for sale at the courthouse.

## POLICE BUSINESS

Police run report for May included 219 calls for Service to Pioneer Village Police Dept.

- ✦ 5/25 on Somerset Dr – report of someone trying to kill the family there. Person reporting said everyone at home is messing with her mentally.
- ✦ 5/26 on Morningside Dr – report of male possibly in area. Caller said male hit her child with a metal pipe and may be a concussion. The male was not around when police arrived. She was advised to report to the County Attorney and take out charges on the male.
- ✦ 5/26 on Cardinal Ave – possible drug overdose. Person was taken to the hospital.
- ✦ 5/30 on Greymont Dr – report of disorderly person. Report is he is in her car and will not get out and leave. When Officers arrived, he fled on foot.
- ✦ 6/2 on Audubon Ave – report of someone harassing caller in a maroon suv. No one was there when Officer arrived.
- ✦ 6/3 on Morningside Dr – report of a male standing next to a silver car yelling. He was talking loud at the person in the car. Officer told him to talk quieter.
- ✦ 6/9 on Johanna Ct – report of a domestic, not physical. Parties were separated for the night.
- ✦ 6/14 on Spring Meadow Dr – report of domestic. The male was physical with the female. He left before officers arrived on scene. She did not require medical attention; she was told to follow up with the County Attorney for and EPO.
- ✦ 6/15 on Cardinal Ave – report of a male overdose on fentanyl. EMS arrived and transported him to the hospital. The male did survive.
- ✦ 6/16 on Ridgemoor Rd - report of an EPO violation, subject was seen in a black Mustang convertible in the area. Officers did not find him in the area upon arrival.
- ✦ 6/16 on Somerset Dr – report of 18-year-old female screaming and causing a scene. She was told to calm down and go inside or she would be taken to jail.
- ✦ 6/19 on White Tail Cir – report of a male with a prosthetic leg rang her doorbell and advised her there was a snake in her front yard. She told police that she did not see which direction he went.
- ✦ There were 4 injury accidents and 7 non-injury accidents since the last meeting.
- ✦ The 4<sup>th</sup> of July Holiday – fireworks allowed on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> from 9pm-11pm per Ordinance.
- ✦ Peggy Druin asked if domestic violence has increased, Chief Reynolds said yes, due to the pandemic. Also, discussion of the Dollar General only having one employee in the store. Chief Reynolds said they need to be more diligent to monitor customers in the store and need to hiring more employees.

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## PUBLIC BUSINESS


- ✦ Resident Garland Conn is requesting the fence in Meadowbrook Subdivision need painted.
- ✦ Denver Matthews thanked the City for the birthday card.

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
## ADJOURNMENT
