MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING 7PM, SEPTEMBER 28, 2021

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall Becknall Community Center 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229. Mayor Gary Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

- ✚ Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from August 24, 2021. Dorleen Garrett made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes with correction. Peggy Druin 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
 - ✚ Dorleen Garrett made a motion to accept the financial report from August 31, 2021. Denver Matthews 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

- ✚ None

NEW BUSINESS

- ✚ Peggy Druin made a motion to donate \$350.00 to the Zoneton Fire District for Halloween Candy. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ✚ Mayor Hatcher and the Council discussed the details of the Pioneer Village Fall Clean Up Day. The City is provided 3–30-yard dumpsters by Waste Management. Mayor Hatcher said last clean-up day they filled two and a half dumpsters. Council decided October 9th as clean-up day from 8am-12pm with a rain date of October 16th.
- ✚ Mike Exton made a motion to accept RLH Rentals 3 bids totaling \$34,886.00 for drainage and ditch work on Pioneer Trail and Acacia Ave. Peggy Druin 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

COUNCIL BUSINESS

- ✚ Peggy Druin inquired about the ARPA funds. Attorney Edison said any project with water, sewer or broadband would need to be bid out, an engineer must sign off on and advertised in the paper. The City could use funds to hire officer if you can show increase of gun violence, homelessness, mental illness, or suicide in the City.
- ✚ Peggy Druin also inquired about the status of 4622 Springfield Ct. Attorney Edison said the mortgage company has not yet moved forward for a judgement.
- ✚ Mayor Hatcher discussed the results of the 2020 Census showing Pioneer Village with a 31.6% increase. However, the Census results from 2010 in Pioneer Village was incorrect.

POLICE BUSINESS
