MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING 7PM, MAY 24, 2022

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall Becknall Community Center 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229. Mayor Gary Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Invocation: by Denver Matthews All recited the Pledge of Allegiance

- ✦ Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from March 22, 2022. Dorleen Garrett made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes as read. Peggy Druin 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ✦ Dorleen Garrett made a motion to accept the financial report from March 31, 2022. Brandon Hatcher 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ✦ There was no meeting for April 26, 2022.
- ✦ Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the financial report from April 30, 2022. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

- ✦ Attorney Edison said the judgement and order for sale on 4622 Springfield Ct is set for public auction on May 31, 2022, at 9am at the old Courthouse.

NEW BUSINESS

- ✦ Peggy Druin made a motion for the City to purchase new flooring for City Hall for \$10,288.00. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ✦ Attorney Edison opened the bids to the public to purchase any or all the 2021 delinquent taxes. No public bids. Dorleen Garrett made a motion for the City to purchase the 2021 delinquent taxes for \$1924.70. Denver Matthews 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ✦ Attorney Edison read the 1st reading of Ordinance 2022-04 FY 2022-2023 Budget.
- ✦ Mayor Hatcher asked for a motion to amend the agenda to move the re-appointment of Tony Thompson from Planning & Zoning to New Business. Peggy Druin made a motion to move the re-appointment of Tony Thompson from Planning & Zoning to New Business. Denver Matthews 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ✦ Peggy Druin made a motion to re-appointment Tony Thompson as Planning Commission Representative for the City of Pioneer Village. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ✦ Chief Reynolds introduced Det. Witherspoon to explain the School Resource Officer Grant for Pioneer Village. Det Witherspoon explained the Federal mandate for the schools: Maryville, Freedom and Hebron Elementary to have a resource officer available. This is a nationwide \$56 million dollar grant for the department to apply for to receive funding for 3/4 of the officer's salary for three years and the fourth year will be funded by the department. The grant will provide the officer's salary plus any benefits except for equipment, uniforms, firearm, and vehicle. The officer will dedicate time to all three schools when in session and then in the summer, will work for the department. No ARPA funds can be used for this mandate of a school resource officer. Brandon Hatcher made a motion to authorize the Pioneer Village Police Department to apply for the grant on behalf of Pioneer Village. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

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COUNCIL BUSINESS

- ✦ Peggy Druin said there is a pothole on Spring Meadow Dr.
- ✦ Dorleen Garrett advised the neighbor behind her neighbor in Meadowbrook subdivision has a shed up against the fence and has a smell like something is dead. Chief Reynolds will check out.

POLICE BUSINESS

- ✦ 3/23 on N Preston Hwy – report of people shooting guns in the air at the cemetery. When officers arrived the people said they were honoring a person who passed away.

- ✦ The new 2022 Ford Explorer should be finished by the end of the week. Due to problems getting equipment in it has taken longer to get it ready for service.

- ✦ Chief Reynolds said on Somerset Dr there was a dog bite incident in the City that occurred on May 24th with a juvenile going into a neighbor's yard to get a bicycle when the dog bit him. The juvenile was transported to the hospital by EMS.
